We hear the call for climate action locally, globally and from faith leaders.

### **City of Dallas Comprehensive Environmental Climate Action Plan (CECAP)**

In May 2020, Dallas released its eight-point plan of action to meet the challenges of climate change and support a sustainable, desirable, equitable future all its residents. The Climate Action Team (CAT) of First Unitarian Church of Dallas was active in developing CECAP and winning approval by the City Council. Now through its RenUUable Power campaign, CAT is joining the implementation of Goal 2 Action 2: Encourage investment in, and greater use of renewable energy.

### **Paris Climate Agreement**

In December 2015, 195 countries and the European Union signed the Paris Climate Agreement to mitigate and adapt to climate change. Despite this historic global achievement, the principal goal, to keep global warming well below 2 degrees Celsius, does not appear likely. Yet actions at the local, national and international levels continue.

### **Laudato Si' – Pope Francis's Encyclical Letter "On care for our common home"**

Pope Francis spoke to Catholics and indeed all people in his 2015 pastoral letter on climate change. He drew upon climate science, global economics and his concern for future generations. Last June, Pope Francis again spoke out issuing a year of Laudato Si' activities and a seven-year call to action that includes divestment in fossil fuel companies.
