As Unitarian Universalists, we rely on seven principles and other sources to provide moral guidance. Several are particularly relevant as we consider how we can make a difference to our environment and the future.

#2. Justice, Equity and Compassion in Human Relations

This principle informs our participation in community, even how we collectively respond and consider our social systems. We know that environmental injustice most affects peoples marginalized by poverty. The growing impacts of climate change will fall further on these communities across the world.

#6. The goal of world community with peace, liberty and justice for all.

#7. Respect for the Interdependent Web of all Existence of Which We Are a Part
